Community Theatre Gets Non-Profit Status

The Rogers City Community Theatre received the coveted status of a 501(c) (3) non-profit group from the US Internal Revenue Service. Although the IRS letter was dated August 6, 2009, the nonprofit status is retroactive to January 5, 2009. This means that all contributions from that day forward are eligible for applicable federal tax deductions.

By receiving nonprofit organization status, the Rogers City Community Theatre becomes eligible to apply for many charitable foundation donations as well.

The Rogers City Community Theatre is a Michigan non-profit corporation, operating under Articles of Incorporation and bylaws and governed by a volunteer Board of Directors. Donations are welcome and are now tax deductible!

Disney's Aladdin Jr. is Part of the First Annual Passport to the Arts Program

"Passport to the Arts" is a summer program highlighting the creative community and the rich, diverse array of art venues and cultural events available in Northeast Michigan. The passport idea is intended to encourage discovery and participation in the arts by residents and visitors alike.

The program's pri-

mary sponsors include the Thunder Bay Arts Council, Besser Museum, NOAA Sanctuary and Art in the Loft in Alpena. The Rogers City Community Theatre is a participating organization in the arts passport region, and has been authorized to stamp passports during all performances of *Disney's Aladdin Jr*.

Passports with the minimum required stamps will be eligible for the prize drawings on October 1. Other passport participants in Rogers City include Domaci Gallery, Presque Isle District Library, and the Presque Isle County Historical Museum. Yes, the long-awaited restoration project for the Rogers Theater is now complete and the building front is restored to its 1937 Art Deco glory. To celebrate, a grand reopening movie party is planned for Wednesday, September 9. The feature film will be "This

Way, Please," including such stars as Betty Grable, Mary Livingstone and Fibber McGee and Molly.

"This Way, Please" was the first film to be shown at the new Rogers Theater when it opened in November of 1937. At that time, the price of

admission was just 25 cents. That price will be honored on September 9, so get your quarters shined and ready.

The façade restoration project was made possible, in part, by a grant from the MI Housing Development Authority to the City of Rogers City.

Community Characters: Andrea Shadbolt

Andrea Shadbolt is the director for this summer's youth theater production of Disney's Aladdin Jr. But Andrea has performed many other roles at the theater. Her first introduction to theater activities came when she attended the local production of Chicago, staged three years ago. "I loved it," said Shadbolt. "I thought, 'I could do that'."

The first performance Andrea participated in was South Pacific, where she performed in the chorus. She also worked lights in Urinetown, as well as helping with sets. She was in the chorus again in Funny Thing Happened on the way to the Forum, along with assisting in work on the costumes.

More recently, Andrea servedas Assistant Director for Hello Dolly, which prepared her for directing Aladdin.

"I am by nature a very shy person, but working with the theater has really brought me out of my shell," said Shadbolt. "Before the theater, I couldn't say two words to anyone. When I saw my children start to take on some of that same shyness, I knew I had to set a better example for them."

Both of Andrea's girls have now participated in the youth summer theater programs, and she has seen a positive effect on their poise and ability to perform in public. According to Andrea, the production of Aladdin Jr. is wonderful for kids

with large or small roles, because the play gives each one of them an opportunity to shine. "The theater has introduced us to many, many wonderful new experiences," said Shadbolt.

About Our Theater

The Rogers Theater was constructed in 1937 as a classic, single screen small town movie palace in the Art Deco style. After a fire in 1947, the theater was re-built and expanded to a seating capacity of 600. Serving as a downtown landmark for decades, the theater was purchased in 2003 by Karl W. Heidemann. The new owner removed some seating to add a stage, theatrical lighting and utility improvements. In 2004, live productions began alternating with first run movies, in a revitalized auditorium with a 424 person seating capacity. An informal group of theater fanatics soon emerged that now constitute the Rogers City Community Theatre. In 2006, a youth summer theater program began. In January 2009, the RCCT incorporated as a Michigan non-profit organization and in August 2009 received approval for federal non-profit status. Community Theatre cast members have ranged in age from 6 to 94. New theater volunteers are always welcome, both on stage and behind the scenes. Come join the fun!
