Open Auditions for *Harvey* September 4 & 5 By Donna Klein, Director

Open auditions for our autumn production of Mary Chase's Pulitzer Prize winning play, *Harvey*, will be held Wednesday and Thursday, September 4 and 5 at 7 pm.

Note: Auditions will be held in the Constance Jordan Room at the Rogers City branch of the Presque Isle District Library, not at the Rogers City Theatre. The library's address is 181 East Erie Street. The Constance Jordan Room is located on the Second Street side of the building. Parking is available in the lot or on the street. There will be a sign on the door for your convenience.

Six men and six women are needed to act in this

hilarious Broadway comedv about an affable fellow, Elwood P. Dowd. and his best friend Harvey. Harvey is a pooka in the guise of a very tall rabbit, and is only seen by Elwood... or is he? Family members, friends, and associates include: Elwood's sister, Veta Louise Simmons, Veta's daughter, Myrtle Mae, the household's maid, Miss Johnson, a socialite, Mrs. Ethel Chauvenet, and Judge Omar Gaffney.

The characters at Chumley's Rest, the sanitarium where the family wants to place Elwood, include: head nurse, Ruth Kelly, lead physician, Lyman Sanderson, orderly, Duane Wilson, head of the facility, William Chumley, his wife, Betty Chumley, and a cab driver, EJ Lofgren.

Rehearsals take place on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings up to production week. Other rehearsals may be added as needed. The production opens on Friday, October 25th and closes on Sunday, November 3rd. Performances take place both weekends on Friday and Saturday evening and Sunday afternoon.

Marketing Survey Results

The Rogers City Community Theatre audience has spoken! We appreciated hearing the views and opinions of everyone who participated in the marketing survey we conducted during the run of Irving Berlin's "Annie Get Your Gun" in March of last year. The survey was available as an insert in the show's playbill and online at rcctheatre.org. We had a total of 235 respondents.

We found out that approximately 75% of respondents currently reside in Presque Isle County. The remainder were from Alpena, Cheboygan, and Montmorency Counties. Approximately 41% of our respondents had attended four or more plays in the past two years. Nearly 80% dents had attended at least two plays in the past two years. Most respondents hear about our plays through the Presque Isle County Advance. the Onaway Outlook, the theater's marquee and our newsletter.

While respondents enjoy all of our shows, more than 75% like musicals, and nearly 70% like plays. Most respondents receive our newsletter via the Postal Service.

Three quarters of respondents are women and our main age group includes people age 56 and older. We added 39 people to our newsletter

e-mail list and 17 people to our mail list. Many respondents provided comments and suggested shows they'd like to see at RCCT.

About Our Theatre

The Rogers Theatre was constructed in 1937 as a classic, single screen small town movie palace in the Art Deco style. After a fire in 1947, the theatre was re-built and expanded. Serving as a downtown landmark for decades, the theatre was purchased in 2003 by Karl W. Heidemann. The new owner added a stage, theatrical lighting and utility improvements. In 2004, live productions began alternating with first run movies, in a revitalized auditorium. In the summer of 2009, exterior restoration brought back the black and orange tile work of the original theatre façade.

Once the stage was available, an informal group of local theatre fanatics emerged that now constitutes the Rogers City Community Theatre (RCCT). In 2006, a youth summer theatre program began as well. Community cast members have ranged in age from 6 to 94. New theatre volunteers are always welcome, both on stage and behind the scenes. Come join the fun!

In 2009, the RCCT incorporated as a Michigan non-profit organization and received IRS approval for federal non-profit status. Contributions are appreciated, and are now tax deductible.
